INFRASTRUCTURES IN CASTILLA Y LEÓN



Road connectivity _

- Crossroads of main international routes: network of over 33,000 km crosses the region in all directions.
- Around 400,000 tons per day are transported on the roads of Castilla y León.
- > 2,500 km are high-capacity roads, of which 91% are toll-free.

Main axis:

- Ruta de la Plata (north-south).
- Madrid-La Coruña highway, A6 (NW, SE).
- Trans-European Transport Network, A-62/AP-1.
- Douro corridor (east-west).



Railways

- **3,000 km of tracks** connecting Castilla y León provinces with each other and with the rest of Spain and Portugal.
- Key to the transport of goods in Spain: Most of the rail freight between the north and the south ports of Spain passes through Castilla y León.
- Second largest Spanish region in high-speed network with 700 km high speed tracks.
- Madrid-Valladolid: 50 min. Madrid-Segovia: 20 min.
- Logistic hubs: 15 hubs, 8 of them intermodal.



Airports and dry ports



- 4 airports: Valladolid, Salamanca, León and Burgos.
- ▶ 60 minutes to Madrid or Barcelona airports.
- Madrid: one of the busiest airports in the world.
- **3 dry ports:** Burgos, Pancorbo (Burgos) and Salamanca.
- ▶ 1 dry port under construction: Valladolid.

Industrial areas

- > 374 industrial areas.

- ▶ 11 technology centres.
- ▶ 10 scientific research institutes.
- ▶ Hundreds of recognized research groups promoted by the universities.
- ▶ 3 million m² designated for the establishment of technology-based innovative companies.

Three technology parks promoted by the Regional Government:

- Boecillo Technology Park (Valladolid): 80 companies and 2 technology centres employing around 4,000 people. Home to a biotech incubator.
- León Technology Park: over 40 companies and 1 technology centre, with more than 2,000 employees.
- Burgos Technology Park: currently in development.
